Principal's News

PEAC TESTING

Our year 4 students undertook assessment for the Primary Extension and Challenge (PEAC) program last Wednesday. All year four students across the state are tested and the most exceptionally able students are selected to take part in the PEAC program in year 5 and 6. The tests measure student's ability to recognise patterns, predict with speed and accuracy and apply knowledge and learning. The tests may identify students who are underachieving at school who have certain attributes that identify them as having potential for high academic performance. Children selected for the PEAC program travel to Narrogin and take part in courses that are designed to offer work that is intellectually challenging for gifted students. The results are also used along with other school based assessments, to select students for our school based extension programs.

Drought Fundraiser

Braeside students had a Free Dress Day to raise money for farmers suffering drought conditions in the Eastern States. \$259 was raised and will be donated to the Buy a Bale program that is operated by the charity Rural Aid. Thank you all for supporting this very worthy cause.

The purpose of this activity is to allow children to show their parents many of the things they have learnt at school throughout this year. This event is an important part of our school's reporting processes and gives parents the unique opportunity to celebrate with your child, their achievements and successes, by showing them the importance you place on their learning at school. This learning journey is time to share in your child's journey rather than a chance to talk to the teacher. We hope parents, grandparents and siblings are able to get away from work and other commitments to be actively involved in the day.

Mental Health Initiatives

This week Mrs Tester and Miss Bielby are both attending professional learning courses that increase their knowledge and skills in the area of Youth Mental Health. Mrs Tester is at Youth Mental Health First Aid which is a course that teaches adults how to assist adolescents who are developing a mental health problem or in a mental health crisis. Miss Bielby will attend the 'Gatekeeper Suicide Prevention' two day workshop designed for professionals and para-professionals in the human ser-

vices whose roles bring them into contact with people at risk of suicide. The knowledge they gain will be shared with all staff and contribute to our Health and Wellbeing focus at Braeside Primary School.

NAPLAN ONLINE – School Readiness Test

You may have heard that NAPLAN Online was introduced in 2018, with 274 schools Western Australian schools participating. Our school will be transitioning to NAPLAN Online in 2019.

NAPLAN online will provide better assessment, more precise results and faster turnaround of information. Your child's results will be returned to the school faster, within a few weeks rather than a few months.

This trial, called the School Readiness Test (SRT), will enable us to assess our technical readiness to implement the new online assessments. In addition it will gives us a chance to try out the new national online assessment platform in a real-life class-room environment

During August 2018, students in Years 3 and 5 will participate in a trial of the assessment platform, by undertaking online readiness tests that include examples of the new NAPLAN online questions. Each test will take about 45 minutes to complete.

Participating in this trial is important as it will help us ensure we have adequate internet connectivity, and whether students have access to sufficient number of devices for NAPLAN Online testing. During the trial, our teachers will have the opportunity to practice managing the classroom logistics for an online assessment and the new test administration processes.

The readiness test has not been constructed to assess curriculum knowledge, but rather to provide students with an opportunity to experience the types of questions that will be included in the new online assessments. As such, reports will not be provided.

Participation in the SRT is a key step to ensuring a successful NAPLAN online experience in 2019.

Science Week at Braeside

As part of National Science Week Braeside Primary School ran a STEM Day. STEM means Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics.

The Senior STEM extension class organised a day of fun and engaging activities for Senior and Junior classes. The activities were taught in a kids-teaching-kids style. The students were divided up into groups with a mixture of age groups. Students rotated to different challenges including flying machines, coding robots, building tents, making pom-pom launchers and many other hands on activities.



The team work that all the groups showed was fabulous to see.



Braeside also celebrated the opening of our brand new Science Room. We have some amazing new resources for the children to use. Miss McGuire has done a fabulous job in setting up the new room and making it such an inviting space for all teachers to use as part of their Science programs.
