# **SCHOOL NURSE**

#### Bedwetting


Bedwetting (also called nocturnal enuresis) is common in childhood.

Most children stay dry during the day around age 3 and at night around age 5.

Bedwetting happens when children don't wake up during night to wee when their bladder is full.



#### This can be because:



- · they sleep deeply
- they make more wee at night than the bladder can hold
- their bladder is small or overactive
- it runs in families.

Bedwetting is not your child's fault and is usually due to factors outside their control. Most children grow out of it with time.

#### Simple things you can try to reduce bedwetting:

- make going to the toilet before bedtime a routine
- use a night light so they can find the way to the toilet
- · avoid caffeinated drinks, which affect the bladder.

Bedwetting doesn't usually mean something serious, but it can sometimes be caused by a medical condition or constipation.

#### You can seek help if:



- you or your child are worried
- your child is unwell (fever, dribbles urine day and night, or pain when weeing)
- there is constipation
- your child was dry but starts bedwetting again
- bedwetting continues beyond age five and half years (5 ½).

#### Find out more

If you have any concerns, speak to your doctor or school health nurse. They can support you with managing things or refer your child to bedwetting services if needed.

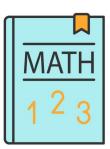
### YEAR 6 CAMP

A big thanks to Miss Leanne Eades, Mr Oscar Bride and Mrs Chris Mills who went along with the students and made sure everything ran smoothly.





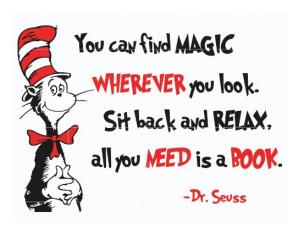
