#### School Structures for 2020

Current numbers indicate that the school will grow slightly in 2020. Planning is under way to increase the school size by a class. We are in the process of recruiting a Manager of Corporate Services, a classroom Teacher and a Physical Education/Science specialist. We take many factors into account when creating balanced classes each year, these include: students academic level, behaviour, students interests, special needs issues and student attitudes. The main consideration is given to input from the student's current teachers, as they know the students learning needs the best. Next newsletter we will publish the proposed school structure and also open up classroom placement forms for parent submission. Classroom placement request forms must detail the reasons for consideration of special circumstances. Special circumstances do not include a specific friend or a request for a teacher.

### ATTENDANCE

#### EVERY DAY COUNTS FOR YOUR CHILDS EDUCATION

If your child misses 1 day per fortnight that equals 1 month per year and adds up to missing nearly 1 and a half years of school i.e. 90% attendance rate.


If your child misses 1 day per week that equals 2 months per year and adds up to missing nearly 2 and a half years of school i.e. 80% attendance rate.

If your child misses 2 days per week that equals 4 months per year and adds up to missing nearly 5 years of school ie.60% attendance.

If your child misses 3 days per week that equals to 6 months per year and adds up to nearly 8 years of school i.e. 40% attendance.

Students who attend 80% or more over fortnightly periods will receive a Zooper Dooper at lunch time on Fridays, beginning Week 2 of Term 4
