Hi everyone,

Lunch and recess times

I wanted to clarify our change of eating and play times. This was agreed to as a staff and with parent consultation. The reason for changing to play first, eat second is:

It's been heartwarming to see the connections already forming between Harriet and our students. Whether it's a few minutes of quiet time or a gentle cuddle, Harriet helps students feel supported and seen. These small moments are having a big impact.

Why Attendance Matters at Braeside Primary School

At Braeside Primary, we believe that every school day counts. Regular attendance is not just a legal requirement — it's a vital part of each child's learning journey. When students attend school consistently, they benefit from high-quality teaching, continuity in learning, and the opportunity to build strong relationships with peers and staff.

Frequent absences, even if they seem minor, can quickly add up to significant gaps in learning. This can affect a child's confidence, academic progress, and overall engagement with school life. Establishing good attendance habits from an early age also sets the foundation for success in later education and beyond.

We work in partnership with families to promote excellent attendance, ensuring that every child at Braeside Primary is given the best possible opportunity to thrive — socially, emotionally, and academically. Together, we can make every day matter.

- · Is prevented from attending by an unavoidable cause or family circumstance, such as bereavement.



MATHS BOOK PAYMENT




Please ensure Maths books are paid to the office as soon as possible, they are part of the booklist item for Students in-class work book.

Colour Blindness



It's good to know if a child is colour blind, as they may struggle in school with activities that use colours, such as drawing and sorting blocks.

Colour blindness might become obvious after the age of 4 years and is more common among boys. Children who are colour-blind can see as clearly as other children but cannot tell the difference between some colours or see colours differently from other children. This usually happens with reds and greens, and sometimes with blues and yellows.

If your child is colour blind, it's good to inform their teacher about the condition. This will allow the teacher to choose activities that don't involve spotting colour differences.

If you have any concerns, colour vision testing can be performed by some General Practitioners (GP), eye specialists or optometrists. You can also contact your local School Health Nurse, Cassie on 98216379 for advice.
