WHY IS GOING TO SCHOOL SO IMPORTANT?

Attending school every day is one of the most important ways to help children succeed. Each day of learning builds on the last, especially in the early years when students are developing key skills in reading, writing, and maths.

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Our ECE team recently completed the National Quality Standard (NQS) audit. The NQS is a national framework that supports early childhood services to reflect on and improve the quality of education and care we provide. Following the audit, our team has taken time to reflect on our current practices and identify areas for continued growth and enhancement.

We're also very excited to share some upcoming developments in our ECE playground area. A general clean-up will begin soon, followed by the creation of a *concrete stream waterway* for water play, with thanks to the generous support of our P&C who have funded this project. This new feature will provide wonderful hands-on learning opportunities through exploration and play. We would also like to thank our P & C for the purchase of a range of large outdoor mats, some of which will also be used in the ECE outdoor space.

Looking ahead, we're planning to extend our bike track, with grant applications currently underway. These improvements are part of a series of ongoing projects to update and enhance our ECE outdoor space, creating a fun, active, and creative environment for all our students to enjoy.

We look forward to sharing these exciting changes with you and welcoming everyone to see our refreshed ECE space soon.






HATS & WATERBOTTLES FOR TERM 4

Sleep

School-aged children need 10 -11 hours sleep a night. Getting a good night's sleep will help your child to be more settled, happy and ready for school, and will strengthen his/her immune system. Here are some sleep tips:

- Keep the bedroom dark, cool and quiet this will help your child drift off easily.

If anxieties or worries are keeping your child from relaxing, acknowledge the feelings and deal with it straight away or plan to sort the issue out in the morning after a good night's sleep. Remember, medication is not the answer to children's sleep problems.
