

Behaviour Data

As we move into the half way mark of the year, I wanted to share some pleasing data with you. Although the data relates to suspensions, the opposing data is equally reflective. The number of Free and Frequent tokens that students have received across the school this term for displaying behaviour that relates to Braeside's Best is through the roof. Mallee have already received their faction total and Acacia and Wandoo are not very far behind. Individual classes are also very close to receiving their class totals. I have included a table of the suspension data from 2015 to today, although only half way through 2019, the data is still astounding. Yellow slip data is also reflective of this, with 98% of students on track to attend good standing for behaviour this term. The change has been bought about through a combined and targeted effort by staff and parents working together to support their students. Our Zones of Regulation and classroom behaviour system has also had significant impact, the Positive Behaviour Support program is continuing this work. Students at Braeside have a clear sense of the behaviour that is expected of them in the classroom and the playground.


Reports

If you have access to old car or truck batteries we would love to hear from you.



Science at Braeside PS

This term in Science, Braeside Primary School Students have explored Chemical Science concepts.

The Year One and Two students are learning about different materials. This includes what things are made of and what makes something strong or weak. These students are constructing houses that can survive wind (a hairdryer) and water.

The Year Three and Four students are exploring different solids, liquids and gases. They are looking at what happens when heat is added or removed to opposing matter. The Year Four students have also investigated natural and processed substances.

The Year Five and Six students are also exploring different states. Students have identified that gases have a mass and are currently learning about different chemical reactions that can occur between matter.

All students are to be commended for their efforts in Science.

Incidence of Ringwo	orm
There has been a rep controlling Ringworm	port of Ringworm in the school community, please take note of the following information for n.
Ringworm:	A common fungal infection of the skin that usually affects the scalp, fingers, skin, toenails and feet.
Transmission:	Skin-to-skin contact with an infected person, infected animals or contaminated articles.
Incubation Period:	Varies with the site of infection.
Infectious Period:	As long as lesions are present.
Exclusion:	Exclude until person has received anti-fungal treatment for 24 hours.
Treatment:	Anti-fungal treatment available - refer to doctor. Bedlinen, towels and clothing should be washed in hot water. Cats/dogs should be examined and treated as necessary.
Contacts:	Do not exclude.
Immunisation	Not available.

School Nurse Information

Hand washing

Washing hands is the easiest way to protect ourselves from contagious diseases, like colds, influenza and gastroenteritis. Hands should be washed before and after eating or preparing food, after going to the toilet and after nose blowing.

When teaching your child to wash their hands:

- Use clean water and soap, making sure they cover their hands and wrists.
- Use a brush to clean under nails if they're dirty too

* Dry their hands with something clean (like a paper towel) Alcohol based sanitizers are useful when soap and water is not available. Use half a teaspoon of the product and encourage your child to rub their hands together until they're dry. If you can see dirt on their hands, it is better to use soap and water.
